




# PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

# **ADMISSION PROCEDURE AND**

## **ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA**

- 1. The admission process is conducted as per the guidelines of MP Higher Education Department and the Government of India.**
- 2. Mode of Admission: Online registration through E-Pravesh Portal (Government approved).**
- 3. Direct on-campus admission (for certain programmes), subject to availability of seats and government directives.**
- 4. Seat Reservations: Implemented strictly as per government norms:**
  - General – 50%**
  - SC – 16%**
  - ST – 20%**
  - OBC – 14%**
  - EWS – 10%**
- 5. National Education Policy (NEP) 2020: All programmes have been restructured under NEP directives since 2021 to provide flexibility, multidisciplinary options, and holistic education.**
- 6. Additional Features:**
  - Options for Major, Minor, Multi disciplinary, foundation and Value-Added Courses.**
  - Skill Development and Placement Support.**

# **ADMISSION PROCEDURE AND** **ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA**

- **Undergraduate Programmes (BBA, B.Com, B.Sc, B.A):**
- **Candidates must have passed 10+2 or an equivalent examination from a recognized board.**
- **Minimum aggregate marks:**
  - **General/OBC/EWS: 45%–50%** (depending on programme).
  - **SC/ST candidates: Relaxation of 5%** as per government norms.
- **Stream Eligibility:**
  - **BBA (3+1 Years): Open to Arts / Commerce / PCM / PCB (minimum 50%).**
  - **B.Com / B.Com (Hons.): Open to Arts / Commerce / Science streams (minimum 45%).**
  - **B.Sc.: Open to Science/PCM/PCB as per subject requirement (minimum 45%).**
  - **B.A.: Open to any stream (minimum 45% for Gen/OBC/EWS, 40% for SC/ST).**
- **Postgraduate Programmes (M.Sc.):**
- **Candidates must have completed graduation (10+2+3 pattern) in the relevant discipline from a recognized university.**
- **Minimum aggregate marks:**
  - **General/OBC/EWS: 45%**
  - **SC/ST candidates : 40%**

# **FEE REFUND POLICY 2025-26**

- **The college receives many representations/complaints from students/parents on non-availability of directions regarding Fee Refund Policy on cancellation/withdrawal of admissions. This policy is made as per the UGC Guidelines on the subject.**
- **Students should be allowed a full refund of fees within a specified period to enable them to opt for a course of their choice,**
- **The following shall be the fee refund policy for the academic session 2024-25:**
  - (a) A full refund of fees shall be made by the Hels on account of all cancellations of admissions/migrations of students up to 30 September 2024 and with a deduction of not more than Rs 1,000, as a processing fee up to 31 October 2024.**
  - (b) For any admission schedule extending/commencing beyond/after 31 October 2024, the provisions contained in the UGC Notification issued in October 2018 on Refund of Fees and Non Retention of Original Certificates shall apply.**
  - (c) This policy will remain in force for subsequent academic sessions until the issuance of a revised policy by the institute.**

- **The UGC has notified the Redressal of Grievances of Students Regulations, 2023, wherein “delay in, or denial of, the refund of fees due to a student who withdraws admission within the time mentioned in the prospectus, subject to guidelines, if any, issued by the Commission, from time to time” has been defined as one of the grievances.**

# QUALITY CONTROL

## ***IQAC***

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) is the central quality monitoring body of the institution. The primary aim of IQAC is to ensure that the institution continues to strive towards excellence in all academic and administrative spheres. Consisting of the coordinator, Principal, Heads of all departments and nominated members from the college, the IQAC functions as a cell that continuously monitors the institutional practices and suggest measures for achieving quality in the institution.

## ***INTERNAL ASSESSMENT***

Continuous assessment of the students is done by the college through class tests, assignments, projects, presentations and other interactive learning activities. The students are required to pass in the internal assessment, failing which they are debarred from sitting in the end term examination.

# QUALITY CONTROL

## *ATTENDANCE*

A minimum of 75% attendance is required for a student to be eligible to sit for the end term examination. Review of attendance is conducted every month by the concerned subject teachers and submitted to the Principal for consequent action.

## *REMEDIAL CLASSES*

The college provides remedial classes to students who require extra learning assistance and also for those students with backlogs. The remedial classes have been initiated specifically to assist the slow learners who need more learning assistance, guidance and support. The remedial classes focus on helping students develop better study habits as well as to enhance their comprehension skills.

## *MENTORING CELL*

Mentoring is an innovative method of encouraging students to become responsible learners thereby empowering them to realize their full potential in their endeavour to achieve success. It is a practice where students are provided with beneficial instruction, inspiration and support. Keeping this in mind, the AIMSAR, Indore has also set up a mentoring cell to serve as a support system for students. Each of the faculty members have been assigned with a number of students who then looks after the progression of the students placed under his/her care.

# LEARNING RESOURCES

## *LIBRARY*

The college library is well equipped which can meet the requirements of the teachers as well as the students in acquiring necessary information in the concerned subjects/courses. Important newspapers, magazines, and professional journals from reputed publishers/journals are subscribed to. ## *EDUCATIONAL TOURS / EXPOSURE TRIPS*




## ***WOMEN CELL***


# PHYSICAL INFRASTRUCTURE AND OTHER FACILITIES

# STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

## ***STUDENT GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL COMMITTEES (SGRC)***

The college has a Students' Grievance Redressal Committee (SGRC) to address student complaints in a fair and timely manner. The committee consists of a Professor as Chairperson, four senior faculty members, and a student representative as special invitee, with due representation for women and SC/ST/OBC categories. The Chairperson and members serve for two years, while the student representative serves for one year. The SGRC ensures natural justice and communicates its recommendations within 15 working days of receiving a complaint. Any student dissatisfied with the decision may appeal to the Ombudsperson within 15 days.



## ***Awards***

AIMSR Indore honors student excellence through a variety of scholarships and awards. Achievement in sports is rewarded with tuition waivers ranging from 10% to 50%, depending on the level of participation or medal secured. The Prabhat Sojatia & Om Sojatia Scholarship offers up to ₹6,000 to outstanding athletes, while wards of staff are eligible for special tuition waivers. Students from economically weaker backgrounds who secure first-division marks may receive need-based aid, and differently-abled students can receive up to a 50% fee waiver. The Chairman's Award further encourages regular attendance with cash rewards up to ₹20,000.



# COLLEGE RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. As per the UGC rules, a student is required to have minimum attendance of 75%.*
- 2. Leave of absence will not be entertained during examination.*
- 3. Refund of fees under any circumstance once admission has been granted as per the UGC norms.*
